CAN I RECYCLE THAT? MONROE MONTHLY RECYCLING TIPS

TIRES

Tires may only be dropped off during Monroe BIG TRASH DAYS /BIG JUNK DAYS
 Tires must be designed for a 21-inch or smaller rim. They must be removed from the rims. (Rims go into the metal bin). They must be clean and not full of dirt and water.

Remember: Monroe recycling is exclusively for Monroe residents only, for items from Monroe residences.

Latex paints or stains should be mixed with kitty litter or sawdust and the cans left open to dry. They can then be disposed of in your regular trash.
