#### MONROE'S LONGEST LIVING CITIZENS



The Boston Post newspaper started a tradition for many New England towns in 1909 when it gave away 700 canes for the purpose of presentation to the town's oldest citizen. No records show that Monroe was one of those towns. However, in 2014 the selectmen were looking for a way to honor Monroe citizens so local woodworker Buster Bates was commissioned to make a custom cane. He crafted and donated the cherry case and yellow birch cane that are on display in the town office as well as the curly maple cane that is presented to recipients. There have been five recipients of the cane since then. The most recent being Ramona Bunnell, age 95, who received it in November.




#### JOIN IN THE CELEBRATION OF THE WINTER SOLSTICE


Did you know the school has a Facebook page where you can check out the many things that are happening? In addition to regular posts, a weekly newsletter is posted.
