company, Clement Property Maintenance, to

Monroe Town Seal t-shirts and crewneck as well as hooded sweatshirts are still available. Can be seen at the Town Office and the Library.

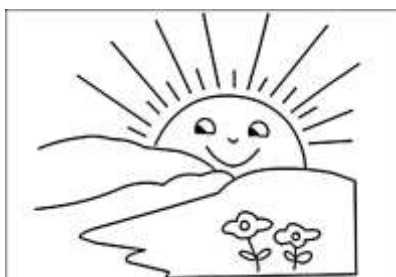
FIRE PERMITS REQUIRED FOR ALL OUTSIDE BURNING
