Hazardous chemicals

Hazardous waste includes insecticides, pesticides, non-latex paint, unused gasoline, pool chemicals, and recyclable batteries.

Do not bring these to recycling. Keep these in a safe place, away from children and pets and save them for a Household Hazardous Waste Collection Day in our town or a local town.

Shredded paper should be tied up in a bag and placed in the mixed paper bin, no loose shreds
