DOG LICENSING

\$7.50 for spayed or neutered dogs, \$10.00 for dogs who are not "fixed" Senior citizens are allowed one dog for \$2.00 once the owner is 65 or older. If they have a second one, that one will cost the regular fees. When you come in to do your dog, you need to present an up to date Rabies certificate and a proof of spaying or neutering. If your information is up to date, you may even do your dog licenses using your credit card on the Town's web site. If your dog is new, you need to come in person for the license. **DUE APRIL 30th**
