SHORT TERM RENTAL OWNERS NEW ZONING ORDINANCE

At the March Town Meeting, the voters of Monroe passed changes to the Zoning Ordinance. One change makes it clear that Short Term Rentals are allowed after the owner submits an application for Site Plan Review and receives approval from the Planning Board. The short term rental application is available on the town website: www.monroenh.org/located under "Forms/Applications". All current and future short term rentals are required to go through this approval process.

Libraries: they have more than just books! Stop in this summer to join our Summer Reading fun!








