Local officials prefer that you obtain a permit online at www.nhfirepermit.com If you are unable to do this, you may contact one of the local deputy forest fire wardens: Russ Brown, Justin Bradshaw, Paul Regis and Matt Yeramian.



FROM THE OFFICE OF THE SELECTMEN

1. Coppermine Culvert Replacement project was awarded to Northwoods Excavating and should get underway soon. Will let you know when the road closes for work to be completed. Questions? Call the Selectmen's Office.
2. Trees will be removed from around the Municipal Building soon. The road into the building will be closed during the day while the work is being done. Please stay safe and watch for the signs. The road will open after hours.
3. Next Big Trash Day will be on Saturday, May 15th from 7 a.m. until 11 a.m. at the Municipal Building. **Household are limited to one cord of wood or one vehicle or trailer measuring 4 x 4 x 8.** No early birds please.
4. Reminder: Recycling: Be sure to read the signs as more types of plastic are allowed. **Items not allowed include:** hazardous waste containers, flower pots, black plastic, buckets, bags, wrap or film plastic, no foam. Be sure to pay attention to what is allowed in each container.
5. Reminder: With better weather, more people will be out riding OHRVs, walking, riding bikes, etc. Be sure to watch for people along the roads. OHRV riders - please remember to follow the rules! See the website www.monroenh.org if you need to read them again.
6. The Town Hall is open for events. The Selectmen have decided to continue the COVID- 19 guidelines so be sure to sign the page of the application acknowledging recommended guidelines for COVID-19 and use of the Town Hall.
